

Masahiko Aoki

Dr. Masahiko Aoki is currently the President and Chief Research Officer (CRO) of the Research Institute of Economy, Trade and Industry (RIETI), Japan. With research interests in comparative institutional analysis, corporate governance, the theory of the firm, and the Japanese economy, Dr. Aoki is also a Henri and Tomoye Takahashi Professor of Japanese Studies in the Department of Economics at Stanford University where he began teaching in 1984. In addition, Dr. Aoki is currently a Senior Fellow at the Stanford Institute of Economic Policy Research (SIEPR).

Prior to joining RIETI and the faculty at Stanford, Dr. Aoki taught at several prominent universities including Harvard University, as an Assistant Professor (1968-71) and Fulbright Visiting Professor (1979-80), and Kyoto University, as both an Associate Professor (1969-77) and Full Professor (1977-92). Dr. Aoki has also served as a Visiting Professor at the University of Tokyo (1994) and Keio University (1996-97).

Dr. Aoki earned his Ph.D. in Economics from the University of Minnesota in 1967. He completed his Bachelor's and Master's work at the University of Tokyo where he received his BA in 1962 and his MA in 1967, both in Economics. Since then, Dr. Aoki has been recognized with several distinguished awards including the Japan Academy Prize (1990), the Hiromi Arasawa Memorial Award (The Association of American University Presses, 1990), and the Schumpeter Prize (1998).

Dr. Aoki is the author of several books including, *Information, Incentives, and Bargaining in the Japanese Economy*, (Cambridge University Press, 1988; translated into French, Spanish, Italian, Chinese, Japanese and Russian languages), *Information, Corporate Governance and Institutional Diversity*, (Toyo Keizai Shinposya, 1955, and Oxford University Press, 2000), and *Towards a Comparative Institutional Analysis*, (MIT Press, 2001). He has also edited and co-authored books such as, *Corporate Governance in Transitional Economies: Insider Control and Roles of Banks*, (World Bank, 1994), *The Role of Government in East Asian Economic Development: Comparative Institutional Analysis* (co-edited with Hyung-ki Kim and Masahiro Okuno-Fujiwara; Oxford University Press, 1997), and *Communities and Markets in Economic Development* (co-edited with Yujiro Hayami; Oxford University Press, 2001).
